

2012 Student Art Contest

COMPLETE RULES



1. Entries must be registered at The Pavilion (403 N. Madison Avenue, Bainbridge Island) between 9:00am and Noon, on Sunday, March 4, 2012, and picked up by artist no later than 6pm that evening. Artwork not picked up by artist will be recycled by the contest workers. We may request that winning artwork remain for a special display.
2. Entrants must be a Bainbridge Island student or resident, currently in grades Kindergarten through High School. If the student cannot deliver their work in person, they must sign the entry form and authorize a parent or guardian on their behalf.
3. There is a \$3 fee per entry. Up to 3 pieces in any medium may be entered by age category, plus up to 3 pieces in the RecycleArt* category (maximum: 6 entries). *Recycle Art entries have additional rules (see below)
4. The art must have been created by the student in the past year. Artwork created by more than one student, group, or an organization is not eligible. Art created in school is eligible, as long as it was created 100% by the student. Adult participation must be limited to advice only. Each entry must be ready to hang or sit on a table. The art must be easily displayed on the lightweight wooden panels provided — students with extremely large or heavy pieces must bring their own display materials.
5. Judging will occur throughout the day, and awards will be presented at 5:00 pm, after which all art must be removed.
6. Contest organizers, workers, volunteers, Pavilion staff, and visitors are not responsible for damage to artwork.
7. Age categories may be further divided in the event that a large number of entries is received for any single category.

*RecycleArt — additional rules:

1. All materials used in RecycleArt entries MUST be made from items that were recycled locally (exceptions are glue and tape), OR include materials that would have otherwise been garbage.
2. All materials used in artwork must be clean and safe (ex. no dirty containers or sharp edges).
3. No glass with sharp edges can be used. Glass should generally be avoided, as should most breakable materials. If using breakable materials, they must be 100% secure for everyone's safety. Please do not use items that contained hazardous materials.
4. Artwork must be able to be moved easily. Artwork cannot be larger than 4'x4'x4', or heavier than 40 lbs.
5. RecycleArt judging will be based on: how creative the artwork is (use of recycled materials), how clean and safe the artwork is, how much of the artwork was made of materials that can be recycled, and the artist's adherence to these contest rules.



Ideas for materials: Paper, newspaper, telephone books, books/records/tapes/CDs, magazines/catalogs, bags, cardboard, aluminum, cans, foil, tires, glass, wood, bottle caps, food containers, clothing/household, plastics, etc.

The purpose of this category is to celebrate Bainbridge's creative youth in a fun way that promotes recycling awareness in our community.
